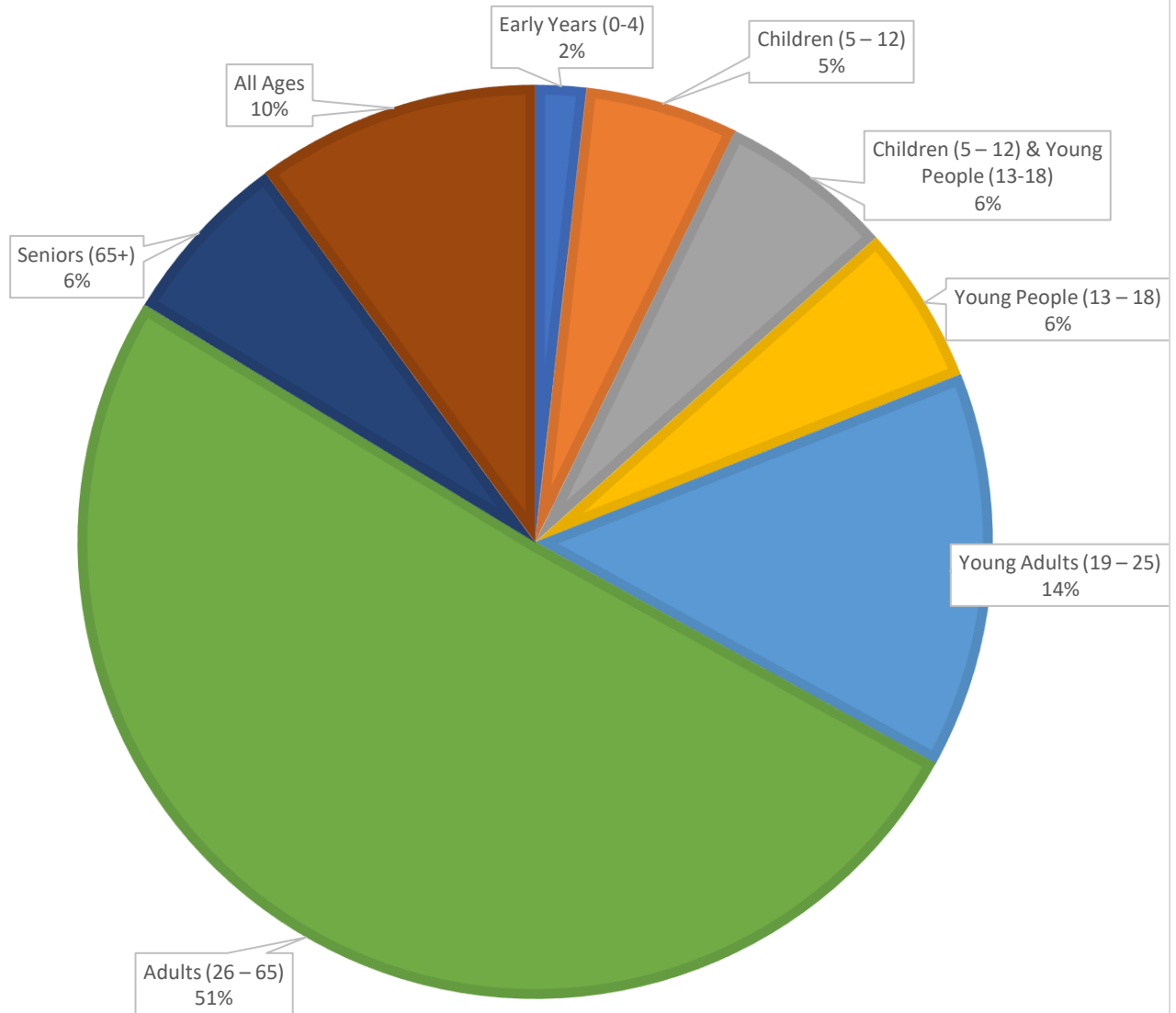

groups in the year:**

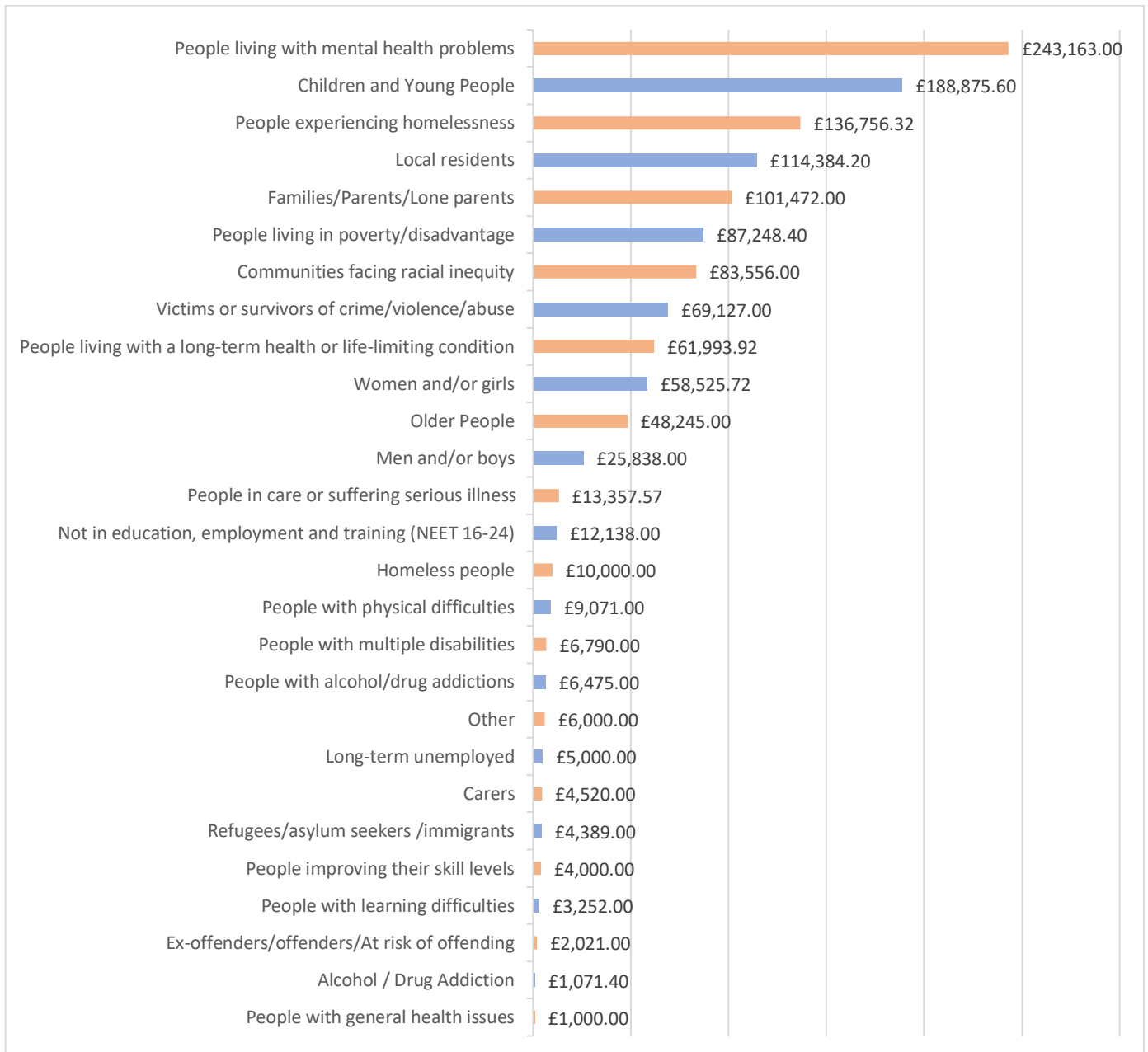

We hope you find these graphs interesting, but please remember they are affected by two main factors. Firstly, we give grants locally for many donors and funders, with different aims which may be based on current need, or on personal preferences/experiences; some may give larger amounts over a year or two, others smaller amounts, but over many years. Secondly, we draw data from the applications forms which all groups submit (to keep a level playing field for all; we offer support with these). So we rely on information groups give us, and of course all we humans are endlessly fascinating and complicated. A local resident might be a woman, who is young, and a carer, or any other combination of characteristics and life experiences, and all or none of these boxes may get ticked on the form. Or a group may tick “all ages” because they open to all but do mainly serve older people.

We will be developing our data systems over the next few years, as it is important to know who is being helped.
