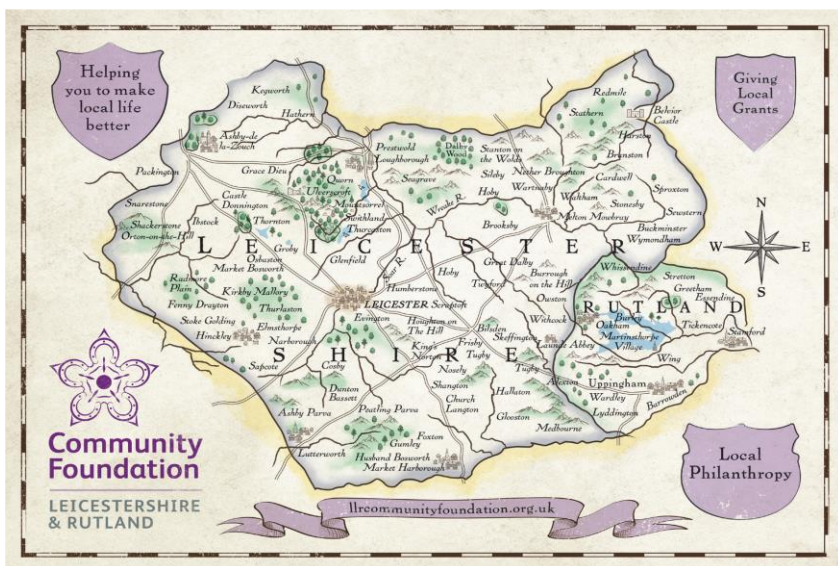

Foreword from Steph Morgan QPM, Chair of Leicestershire and Rutland Community Foundation

The financial year to March 2020 seems an age ago. Just as it was drawing to a close, the Community Foundation was plunged into giving emergency grants at unprecedented levels and speeds, to try to mitigate effects on local people worst hit by the coronavirus pandemic.

The money for the emergency grants came from the National Emergencies Trust, the Department of Culture, Media and Sport, and many of the fantastic philanthropic family and company grant-giving funds we administer.

However, the events of 2020 don't detract from the great generosity and good work of 2019. All the grants here played an invaluable part in ensuring that our local charitable, voluntary and community groups were able to respond as swiftly and effectively as they did to COVID-19.

When a grant helps to pay for volunteer training or equipment or overheads, a group becomes stronger and more secure. When a grant pays for support for people struggling with mental or physical health challenges, or for a lunch club for elderly people who might otherwise become isolated, or to support young people into

employment, those people grow happier, healthier, more resilient and connected.

The charitable, voluntary and community groups that Community Foundation donors support are not household names. They can't pay for TV adverts and they don't (often) win prizes. But they are deeply committed and connected to our local communities, so giving to them means that, in better times as well as in crisis, you are strengthening our local social fabric.

Thank you to the family and company donor funds who use the Community Foundation to give grants so generously. This next year is not going to be an easy one, as we continue to manage the impact of the pandemic, but your investment into Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland is profoundly valuable to all who live and work here.

Donations and Grants

A grant is given in response to a charitable group’s application for something they need to help others. It can be anything – rent, equipment, staffing, volunteer costs; or “unrestricted i.e. the group spend it as they see fit.

We always assess applications to make sure the organisation is viable, charitable, and that we can match it to a fund’s aims. The group then signs a brief agreement to spend the grant as intended, and to report back. We track all grants and in the very unlikely event of underspend or misspend will ask money to be returned for another local need.

A grant is a good way to understand how well charitable groups work, and the needs that they support. It enables local philanthropic donor families and companies, or public agencies, to see the impact of their giving.

A donation is usually a smaller amount, given without an agreement on how it will be spent; and we don’t expect a report back. It is a helpful addition to a charitable group’s overall budget.

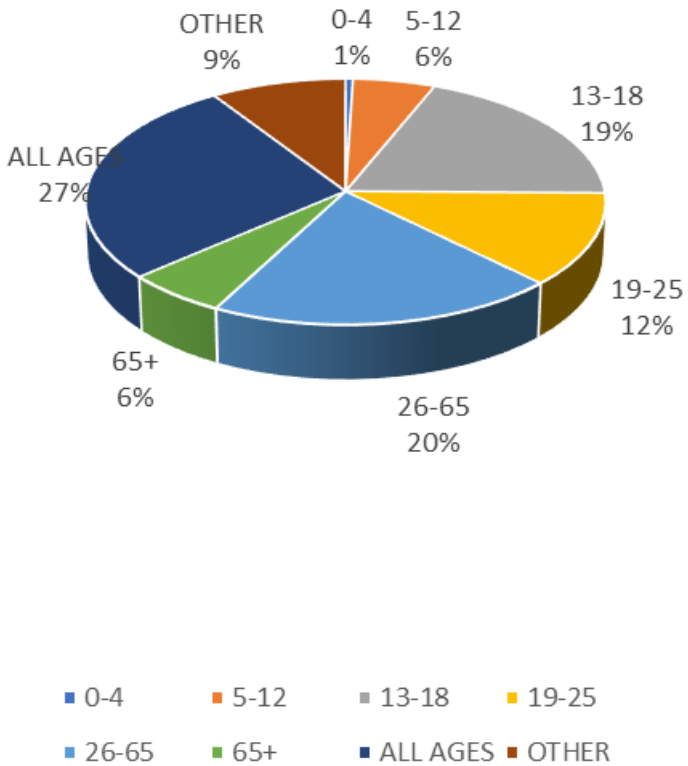

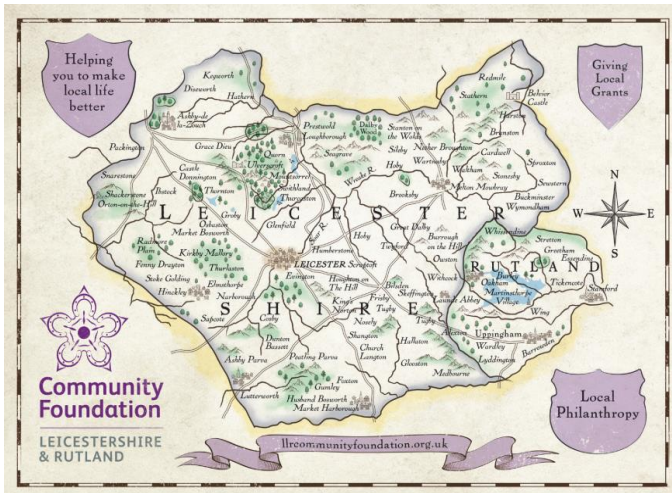
